There are a few people in particular to thank most sincerely for helping to launch "The Heart of Cape Town" project and flood Cape Town with hearts: Lydia van der Merwe, Sacha and Khaoua Grassi, Pierre Toich, Rabson Chipelesa, Roberto and Naomi Stemmet, and my partner, Collin Titus.

We only kicked off this project in the middle of December 2023 and already it has gained significant traction.

This is the first installment of a letter to myself.

Heart of Cape Town

Dear James and Friends

The last few months of 2023 were extremely challenging for me and many people in the world. Humanity beared witness to extreme levels of violence and suffering, both in South Africa and in various parts of the world. In Cape Town gang violence is ravaging communities on the Cape Flats, and it has become so normalized that it does not even make the news anymore. I was really traumatized by the kind of violence that we were witnessing daily in the last quarter of 2023.

On Thursday, the 7th of December, we were having dinner in Kalk Bay, Cape Town, and purchased a beautiful illuminating blue heart from a Zimbabwean artist named Jonah. Hanging the blue heart up in our garden, I had the most profound spiritual experience of my life. It was an overwhelming sensation of peace, kindness and love in my spirit. It was also a message from higher realms of consciousness to share the message of the heart as far and wide as possible.



The next day I returned to Kalk Bay to find Jonah and order more hearts to give away as gifts and tokens of appreciation to people for their beautiful hearts, their kindness and generosity to me and Uthando over the years. Without fail everyone who received a heart just loved it.



Within days of purchasing the heart, I also found an outlet for the trauma that I was experiencing watching the daily violence.

We registered a website called www.theheartofcapetown.org, which reflects a heartfelt desire for peace, love, kindness and compassion in the world.

I find it interesting that the logo for Cape Town Tourism includes a HEART. Well, now we have an actual heart, a bright beautiful illuminating heart that can truly capture the imagination of visitors to South Africa.

There are 900 people attending We Are Africa in May; this includes tourism companies from all over Africa and the world, as well as high profile journalists.

With a small investment of R297 000.00 (R330.00 per heart), each and every person can receive a beautifully hand-crafted heart which illuminates beautifully at night. If the heart is too big to take home, people can gift the heart.

There are 160 people in total attending ILTM in April. The cost for this show would be R52 800.00

WTM is a massive show, so not everyone would be able to receive a heart, but certainly high-profile people in the global tourism industry could do so. So, if WTM handed out 200 hearts, the cost would be R66 000.00.

So, for a total of R415 800.00, we can literally flood the world with hand-crafted, beautiful illuminating hearts. With the production of gift boxes or packets and the message from South Africa, the total cost would be around R450 000.00 maximum.
